Ministry Training Program

The Ministry Training Program is a 15-month leadership development program that both discovers leaders with a call for international ministry as well as equips the leader or pastor for transformational ministry to people groups around the world. Candidates learn how to revitalize their ministries, build intentional community with each other in partnership with the local Church, receive personal mentoring and strategize about ministry multiplication. Candidates are further equipped as ministers, ministries are enriched and the mission is empowered, all unto seeing the gospel go forth around the world.

Program Features

I. Leadership Trainings (weekly)

Leaders and pastors attend regular online leadership trainings led by Pastor Fady Al-Hagal in partnership with seasoned, experienced pastors and ministry leaders from the community. Weekly trainings consist of intercessory prayer and worship, biblical video teachings and small group discussion. Program teaching topics include Character, Leadership, Theology, Disciple-Making and Cultural Transformation. These regular training times facilitate times of enhancement, unity as the Church, accountability and the strengthen ties of spiritual family as we come together.

II. Small Groups (weekly)

Led by our ILC candidates, regular participants in the leadership program participate in virtual small groups, or meeting rooms, as a continued relational opportunity with one another. Small Groups help leaders with personal application questions as a follow-up from the leadership trainings, accountability with one another, intentional community building

through retreats, events, or outreaches and also give candidates an opportunity to lead amongst their peers.

III. In-person worship and prayer nights (once a month)

We will resume our Community Night gatherings once a month to continue to foster relationships and unity. We believe in-person events are just as vital as the continuation of our learning and equipping. Appropriate measures will be taken to abide by healthcode standards and limited numbers of people as necessary.

III. Mentoring and Partnership

A. Person - Equipping the Minister

In partnership with a local (American) church, the ILC candidate will be partnered with a local (American) seasoned leader within their respective body 6-8 months after the start of the program. This relationship will allow both nationalities to discover one another (including personality, character, passions, family, ministry, culture, background, etc.) unto helping to develop personal/social/spiritual strategy for health with regular progress evaluation under the covering of the ILC. Candidate may learn and receive mentoring in (not limited to):

- Social Development (job skills, time management, work ethic, life skills, home life)
- Interpersonal Relationship Development (people skills including parenting, marriage, friendships, leadership)
- Spiritual Development (scripture interpretation, daily devotional time, witness and evangelism)
- Finances (budgeting, stewardship, goals)

B. Practice - Enriching the Ministry

In partnership with the local (American) church, ILC and/or community based ministries, an evaluation on the overall health of the candidate's

ministry will lead to opportunity to see revitalization of the form, function and flow of all areas of respective ministry. This includes assistance with the development of:

- Mission, Vision and Values
- Implementation of discipleship processes
- Assessment and releasing of biblical leadership within ministry
- Future ministry multiplication

Candidates with a passion and call for ministry to lead amongst an international people group but do not currently actively lead one, will work with the ILC and local (American) church to strategize about the planting of new ministries, either locally, globally or both, based on the gifting of the candidate.

Candidates will be resourced with ministry development applications including but not limited to conferences, workshops, seminars, books, podcasts, teachings, simulations, etc.

Upon acceptance into the program, candidates are eligible for monthly financial support from the ILC and/or local church, to be determined.

C. Purpose - Empowering the Mission

Upon a qualitative ministry health evaluation, ministry expansion that leads to future strategies for ministry multiplication allow the candidate to see the overall growth desired for his/her ministry. With the assistance and partnership of the ILC and local church/ministry, candidates will work and pray together about the future opportunities, locally and globally, to see greater local impact with a global imprint that allows for regular international trips for both the (local) American church and international church.

Local American Church Partnership

Candidates upon acceptance into the Ministry Training Program will be strategically partnered with a local American church congregation and experienced leader within respective body to disciple, mentor and coach the candidate and offer ministry support. Candidates receive the benefit of relationship, one-on-one, that helps to strengthen, equip and develop the leader personally and ministerially, as well as offer resources and counsel to enrich the ministry and develop it more fully. Overall function of partnership will be determined by both the ILC, candidate and the local church for agreed upon precepts.

Commitment: 2 or 4 year partnerships (renewable based on the agreement of all partners involved)

This program feature includes:

- I. Mentor to Candidate Partnership (see Ministry Training Program handout, Equipping the Minister)
 - A. One-on-one mentorship
 - I) We recommend at least a monthly meeting to share experiences and assist in the development of the following areas:
 - Personal Development (devotional life accountability, understanding personal sabbath, English Language, personal ministry role, personal goals, budgeting/finance)
 - Social Development (job skills, time management, technology skills (ie computers), work ethic, public relation skills)

**Assessments done every six months by the ILC on the development and commitment of Candidate and Partner.

- I. Church to Ministry Partnership (see Ministry Training Program handout, Enriching the Ministry)
 - A. Mentor to Church/Congregation/Ministry
 - I) We recommend every other month regular meetings with the Candidate involving ministry coaching, ministry enrichment and preparations in the following areas:
 - Ministry health, structure, vision clarity
 - Team building and unity
 - Theological soundness
 - I. Church Planting of international congregation (see timeline attached)
 - A. Church/Congregation to Candidate Church/Congregation/Ministry
 - Mutual mission/outreach and fellowship opportunities
 - Invitations to leadership meetings, appointments, gatherings, etc. if applicable

**Assessments done every six months by the ILC on the development and commitment of Candidate and Partner.

II. Local Church to ILC and Candidate

- A. Pray for our mutual partnership and the ministry of the ILC in Middle Tennessee
- B. An active invitation to attend the weekly ILC Ministry Trainings for follow up and awareness of our ministry
- C. Continued American church equipping and education concerning the development of ministry among the people groups of Middle Tennessee
- D. Consideration for a one-time financial contribution or being added to your missions budget for the year to sustain momentum and ministry among the international community/unreached people groups of Middle Tennessee

Through your partnership, we are expectant to see:

I. Personal Growth in the Candidate

- a) Commitment to ministry and the call of God in their life
- b) Growing passion to accomplish intended personal goals
- c) Growing desire for more equipping and growth opportunities, both personally and professionally
- d) Transformation in communication and relational skills

II. Professional Growth in the Candidate

- a) Clarity for ministry direction and targeted audiences
- b) Development as ministry leader in leadership, team building and vision casting
- c) Growth in the area of disciple-making, both systematically and in implementation, including multiplication strategies, locally and globally

III. Ongoing Partnership with the ILC

- a) Unity in fulfilling the Great Commission in Middle Tennessee via life-style evangelism and disciple making by Word and Deed
- Building a life-time relationship, together supporting and resourcing each other's mission as the Church in Middle Tennessee and beyond

FAQs

Frequently Asked Questions

1. What is the online Ministry Training Program?

a. The online Ministry Training Program is a 15-month training program for leaders and pastors of foreign ministries, moving from our in-person gatherings to exclusively online for the foreseeable future. All teachings and small group discussions will begin to be hosted through an online educational classroom platform called <u>Teachable</u> that we will share via Zoom every Monday evening.

2. How does it work?

- a. **Monday nights Zoom-** Through Zoom (video chat) on Monday evenings, we will login together to Zoom.
 - i. We will have a time of prayer and worship together.
 - ii. Play a 30-minute pre-recorded video teaching for everyone.
 - iii. Small Group Discussion via virtual meeting rooms led by ILC leaders. Questions are provided.
- b. **Online Classroom Login-** Registered ILC candidates who have applied and been approved to the ILC Ministry Training Program will receive their own login to access video teachings, notes and the discussion boards to access during the week.
 - i. You will have access to the notes via your own login to the classroom platform (if you are a registered program candidate) to follow along with the video teaching.
 - ii. For any visitors joining us, we will provide an online link to the notes to follow along in the chat via Zoom.
 - iii. Candidates can also access the teachings during the week, should they be absent to attend the Monday night Zoom, receive the notes and add their personal comments, questions, feedback to the discussion board within the online classroom. Students are encouraged to stay up-to-date with the teachings on their own should they not attend Mondays.
- c. Teachings go live ONE month (or every 4 weeks) at a time and you cannot watch the next teaching till you have completely watched the previous teaching.

3. Who is this for?

a. The ILC is for leaders and pastors who feel a call to ministry leadership. These are both foreign and domestic ministers who are looking for further equipping, support, resources and community. You either are an international residing in the U.S. or abroad, or you are an American with a call to international ministry/missions, locally or internationally.

4. Can I host a small group and lead them through this on another evening?

- a. Yes, eventually. Ideally, we'd love to see this be multipliable for pastors and leaders to utilize the platform for other groups or cohorts. We will announce the dates for this soon. We will have a similar registration process for any and all participants to access the teachings.
- b. Please do NOT share your login information with anyone outside of the ILC.

5. How long is a semester? How much time do I need to commit?

- a. The ILC begins it's year every September and ends the following year in May, while also recognizing breaks for major holidays.
- b. Our Monday evenings generally last anywhere from 2-3 hours. Any additional time outside of Monday evenings for further study is encouraged but not required.
- c. We are requiring and strongly encouraging regular attendance to stay up to the date curriculum and/or staying up to date with the teachings inside the online classroom on your own should you miss a Monday evening.

6. How do I sign up? What's the next step?

- a. For those who have officially graduated the ILC (you have received a graduation certificate from the ILC), you will automatically be enrolled in the online program. You'll receive an email inviting you to confirm your email address and set your password.
- b. For new leaders/pastors, or those who have been attending the ILC sporadically, an application will be required for access to the online classroom on a regular basis. To apply and get more information, leaders can visit our website. https://ilcoalition.com/ministrytrainingprogram



ii. Once we've received your application, our ILC team will review your application. Once you've been accepted into the program, you will receive an email with instructions to sign-in.

7. When does this start?

- a. We will officially start full-time online starting February 8th, 2021. We will not be meeting in person for Monday night teachings. Once every 5 weeks, we will host an in-person worship and prayer night. Details to be announced.
- b. We will only take new signups twice a year.

8. How do I login?

- a. You can access the login page also <u>here</u>. Click on login in the top upper right hand corner.
- You can also access the online classroom via our website.



d. You can also download the Teachable app from any app store to access the teachings and notes.



9. What tech capabilities do I need?

- a. Simply a smartphone or laptop/desktop computer with wifi access will do.
- b. To download the Teachable app,
 - i. Go to the App Store on your device or Google store.
 - ii. Search for Teachable
 - iii. Click the Get button.
 - iv. Click Install.
- c. To utilize the discussion portion of our teachings in the online classroom, you will need to use a desktop version of the website. **The discussion portion is not accessible via the mobile app.**

10. Are visitors allowed?

- a. We will allow visitors to 2 complimentary visits to our Monday nights online. Please email Grace at grace@ilcoalition.com to get access to our Zoom link for the evening.
- b. We will also meet in person once a month for a time of prayer and worship.
